# New Program: Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists

The Doris Duke Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists Program (DDFRCS) has been developed to provide innovative institutional solutions to reduce faculty attrition by assisting junior faculty facing extraprofessional demands.

The DDFRCS provides broad-based education to raise awareness and implement new interventions, as well as resources and mentoring to support junior faculty facing extraprofessional challenges.



Program benefits include one-year grants of \$30,000-\$50,000 to fund a wide variety of assistance, including salary for technical or administrative support and up to 25% salary support to be used to reduce clinical obligations. The program also includes mentors, networking opportunities, and bi-annual programs focused on career development training.

To be eligible, DDFRCS applicants must be Washington University physician scientists (MD, DD, or MD/PhD degree) at the instructor or assistant professor level, and be no more than 10 years beyond an assistant professor appointment. Applicants must also be a PI on a NIH, other federal agency or foundation-sponsored grant for research project support or career development and be able to provide a compelling rationale for why funds are needed to maintain scientific productivity in the face of extraprofessional demands.

Letters of Intent are accepted on a rolling basis. Application deadlines are scheduled for April 1 and October 1.  $\underline{Read\ More >}$
